



Online Safety at Redland

At Redland Primary School, we believe it is essential to safeguard our children from potentially harmful and inappropriate online material. We have a whole school approach to online safety, with an understanding that it is everybody's responsibility.

Redland is aware that some of our children may have unlimited and unrestricted access to the internet via personal devices such as mobile phones and tablets. Children will be taught how to use these appropriately, including the benefits and risks of the 4Cs (content, contact, conduct and commerce). See

At Redland we understand how important it is for parents and carers to be aware of what their children are being asked to do online, including any sites they will be asked to access and be clear who their child is going to be interacting with online. Children will not be asked to interact with anyone who is not part of Redland Primary School.

All websites accessed by children will be risk assessed by their teacher, and usage will be closely monitored.
